

# Revisiting the domain Object

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## recent events

- Forward domain: objects (almost) removed from DB
- No shadow objects anymore
- Sole purpose now DNS reverse provisioning
- ...and ENUM, not to forget

## Attributes in the domain: object

domain: [mandatory] [single] [primary/lookup key]
descr: [mandatory] [multiple] [ ]
org: [optional] [multiple] [inverse key]
admin-c: [mandatory] [multiple] [inverse key]
tech-c: [mandatory] [multiple] [inverse key]
zone-c: [mandatory] [multiple] [inverse key]
nserver: [optional] [multiple] [inverse key]
ds-rdata: [optional] [multiple] [inverse key]
sub-dom: [optional] [multiple] [inverse key]
dom-net: [optional] [multiple] [ ]
remarks: [optional] [multiple] [ ]
```

## Attributes in the domain: object (ii)

```
notify: [optional] [multiple] [inverse key]
mnt-by: [mandatory] [multiple] [inverse key]
mnt-lower: [optional] [multiple] [inverse key]
refer: [optional] [single] [ ]
changed: [mandatory] [multiple] [ ]
source: [mandatory] [single] [ ]
```

## sub-dom

- optional, may list sub domains
- not supposed to be FQDNs
- current usage (for reverse)
  - list the country code
  - list all sublings (x-references)
  - random
  - ... some get it right
- what's the perceived need or intended purpose?

## dom-net

- *list o IP networks in domain*
- purpose?
- usage less than 1%
- any sense for the reverse tree at all?

## nserver

- still optional (credits to Denis)
- but object's purpose is provisioning!

## mnt-lower

- authorization in the reverse tree is via `inet6num`
- again, no shadowed objects
